

Thyme Linalol

(*Thymus vulgaris* – chemotype *linalol*) Botanical Family: *Labiatae*

Perennial dwarf shrub growing to 20 cm high, with woody stems, tiny leaves and pink-lilac flowers.

Plant Part used: flowering tops

Method of Extraction: steam distillation

Countries of Production: France, Spain

Fragrance: soft, woody, herby

Note: middle

Main Chemical Components:

linalol, β -carophyllene, thymol, p-cymene

General Effect: stimulating, soothing
