(*Citrus aurantium*, *C. bigaradia*, *C. vulgaris*) Botanical Family: *Rutacea*

The bitter-orange tree, standing up to 10 metres high, produces the small, white, waxy flowers from which this oil is made.

Plant Part used: flowers

Method of Extraction: steam distillation

Countries of Production: Tunisia, Algeria, France, Italy

Fragrance: highly radiant, sweet, floral

Note: top to middle

Main Chemical Components:

linalyl acetate, linalol, geraniol, nerolidol, neroli
